WARNING: Masks are not for babies!

Parkview pediatrician and Indiana American Academy of Pediatrics President Tony GiaQuinta, MD, wants caregivers to know that, while masks are being recognized to help reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19, they are *not appropriate for everyone*.

- Babies and children under the age of two should not wear a mask.
- Facial coverings can make it difficult for babies to breathe and are not safe. To protect your baby:
 - o Practice social distancing.
 - o Avoid close interactions with people who do not live within your household
 - Avoid taking your baby out for nonessential reasons

Infant Vaccines:

The CDC recommends that childhood immunizations be maintained during the COVID-19 Pandemic. Super Shot is open to provide vaccinations by appointment and practicing social distancing by: spreading out appointments, limiting one parent to one child being vaccinated, checking the temperature of everyone coming in the door, moving families to a cleaned exam room as they check in, and limiting the time in our facility through expedited paperwork.

- o a total of 205,837 low-income Hoosier renter households who will need short-term emergency rental assistance in the wake of the pandemic.
